## RAD-ical changes for the City's Housing Authority Residents

For most of us, it's unimaginable to live without heat or hot water, but that's what many of NYCHA's residents have done repeatedly for years. Vital Improvements were needed for units that would otherwise continue to fall into disrepair.







A major federal housing program enacted in 2012 called Rental Assistance Demonstration, or RAD, was created in the Obama years to allow local governments to get funding to upgrade public housing while still receiving public subsidies for low-income tenants. The Plan was to convert thousands of apartment and provide life-essential upgrades for boilers, ensuring proper heating, hot water and electricity
